

The Maine Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the Town of Skowhegan, will be implementing a new traffic pattern on a trial basis in downtown Skowhegan. Beginning on Wednesday, September 21st, trucks with four or more axles traveling north on Route 201 will be directed to use Route 150 and High Street. Passenger vehicles and trucks with three axles or fewer may continue to access Route 201 northbound using Commercial Street.



Temporary barriers, curbing, and new signs will be installed as part of this trial project to direct traffic and discourage truck use of the passenger vehicle route. Larger trucks traveling north on Route 201 should stay in the right lane after crossing the Margret Chase Smith Bridge. Passenger vehicles traveling north on Route 201 or vehicles heading for Court Street should use the left lane.
